<u>NOMTA SONATA CONTEST</u> Guidelines for Students & Parents

These guidelines are to be distributed to and red by each participant and the parent *before* entering in the contest each year.

The purpose of the NOMTA Sonata Contest is to encourage excellence in the performance of sonata and sonatina literature and to provide a yearly goal for which students may strive. Our desire is to encourage and reward all participants at all levels of study.

CHECK-IN TIME:	Atleast 15-minutes prior to scheduled performance time. The group in which the student is to perform will be called frequently as you wait in the designated waiting area. Students are to perform in order placed. Anyone arriving late will be allowed to perform after the other contestants in the group and will receive the judges' evaluations. If all participants in a certain level have all performed, and the student is late, then he/she will NOT be allowed to perform. Those in Levels 12 & 13 should bring <i>original copies of the repretoire</i> with numbered measures; all others do not need music.
PERFORMANCE:	Students will perform ONLY in-front of the judges. Participants, pleast limit warm-up in the performance room to a cadence, scale, and/or arpeggio (approximately 15 seconds).Do NOT use the piece as a warm- up. Students who do not abide by this limitation can be disqualified.
CRITERIA:	We strive to select the most qualified judges possible. Judges are given general guidelines for choosing winners, but they hold the ultimate responsibility of determining specific criteria for awards. All judges decisions are final! <i>Any student, parent, or teachaer confronting or</i> <i>arguing with a judge, contest committee member, or NOMTA member</i> <i>regarding the judges' decisions, will result in the student's ineligibility to</i> <i>participate in the following year's contest.</i> Please remember that the true value of this contest is in the preparation of the music and in the performance experience, rather than tin the goal of winning an award.
AWARDS:	First, Second, Third Place, and Honorable Mention winners will be rewarded following the completion of the entire group, awards will be announced approximately 20-minutes after the completion of the performances in each level. First, Second, and Third Place winners will receive trophies, and Honorable mention winners will receive medallions Winners' names will be posted in the main lobby throughout the day. Each participant will receive a ribbon, a certificate, and the judges' evaluations for their performance from his/her teacher at a future time.

Sonata Contest Entry Rules:

1. The contest is limited to students through high school of NOMTA members. Students may enter one category.

NOTE: Categories that are very large will be divided according to age. Please list age accurately.

- 2. 1ST PLACE RULE: This rule stipulates that a 1st place winner must proceed to the next higher category in the following year.
- 3. All music must be memorized and performed WITHOUT repeats, unless specified on the Sonata Contest list.
- 4. Each student play one time only for the judges and an audience. Ratings are 1st, 2nd, 3rd, HM, excellent, and Very Good.
- 5. If a student does not arrive during the time the group performs or is taught the incorrect movement of a piece,he/she will be allowed to perform but will not be qualified to place.
- 6. Trophies will be given to placed winners in 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place. Medals will be given to HM winners, and all participants will receive a ribbon that will be given out by the teacher.
- 7. Please have students wear APPROPRIATE attire! (no shorts, jeans, tanktops, flip-flops, etc..)
